Hague System

- «International» registration
- Closed system 70 Contracting Parties (CP)* → entitlement = connection with a CP through
- Nationality
- Domicile
- Real and effective industrial or commercial establishment
- Residence (1999 Act only)




Hague System

- NO need of a basic national application/registration
- Possibility to designate the country of origin
- An application may include up to 100 different designs (if they all belong to the same class of the Locarno Classification)
- Formalities to fulfill + payment of fees







- ONE language (FR/EN/SP)
- Payment of ONE set of fees in ONE currency (CHF)
- Direct filing with the International Bureau of WIPO



- Examination of the application (formalities only)
- Recording in the International Register
- Publication in the Bulletin

- Notification of the registration to the designated CP



IP Office of designated CP:


- Substantive examination of the application according to the domestic legislation
- Protection granted or refused (refusal period: 6 to 12 months)
- If protection granted/not refused: the registration has the same effect as a national registration in the designated CP, under the law of that CP
- If protection refused: the IP Office notifies the IB



- Modifications → WIPO
- Change in name and address of the holder
- Change in the ownership of the international registration
- Renunciation
- Limitation of some only of the industrial designs
- Minimum duration of protection: 15 years




NUMBER OF DESIGNS **CONTAINED IN APPLICATIONS** 19,429 [↑] 3.8%






TOP 10 COUNTRIES
